Ownership of Deliverables, page 41

The Offeror affirms it grants a license, not ownership, to the State for Pre-existing Materials. Further, ownership must follow invention. We do not grant a worldwide, non-exclusive, royalty-free, perpetual license.

License in commercial matters, page 42

The Offeror affirms it grants a license, not ownership, to the State. Further, ownership must follow invention. We do not grant a worldwide, non-exclusive, royalty-free, perpetual license.

General Warranties, page 43

Please change all warranties to *representations*. The Contractor will represent but not warrant the terms of this clause.

General Exclusion of Warranties, page 44

Please change all warranties to *representations*. The Contractor will represent but not warrant the terms of this clause.

Indemnity, page 44

Please remove this section. A state entity cannot indemnify another state entity. Usually this is handled with a clause that states each party to the contract will be responsible for its own acts and omissions. Such a statement would replace the Indemnity clause.

Limitation of Liability, page 44

Limit clause to item 1. Ohio Law will govern liability and both parties are instrumentalities of the State.
