This Requirements Contract is effective beginning and ending on the dates noted above unless, prior to the expiration date, the Contract is renewed, terminated or cancelled in accordance with the Contract Terms and Conditions.

This Requirements Contract is available to DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES, DIVISION OF WILDLIFE, 2045 MORSE ROAD, BUILDING G, COLUMBUS, OHIO 43229, as applicable.

Agencies are eligible to make purchases of the listed supplies and/or services in any amount and at any time as determined by the agency. The State makes no representation or guarantee that agencies will purchase the volume of supplies and/or services as advertised in the Invitation to Bid.

SPECIAL NOTE: State agencies may make purchases under this Requirements Contract up to \$2500.00 using the state of Ohio payment card. Any purchase that exceeds \$2500.00 will be made using the official state of Ohio purchase order (ADM-0523). Any non-state agency, institution of higher education or Cooperative Purchasing member will use forms applicable to their respective agency.

SPECIAL CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

AMENDMENTS TO CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS: The following Amendments to the Contract Terms and Conditions do hereby become a part hereof. In the event that an amendment conflicts with the Contract Terms and Conditions, the Amendment will prevail.

DELIVERY AND ACCEPTANCE: Supplies will be delivered to the participating agency within ninety (90) days after receipt of order and, in accordance with paragraphs S-8, S-9, and S-10 of the SUPPLEMENTAL CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS. The delivery location will be noted on the purchase order issued by the participating agency. Acceptance (transfer of title) will occur upon the inspection and written confirmation by the ordering agency that the supplies delivered conform to the requirements set forth in the Contract. Unless otherwise provided in the Contract, acceptance shall be conclusive except as regards to latent defects, fraud, or such gross mistakes as amount to fraud.

MULTIPLE AWARD CONTRACT: This bid is issued to establish a Multiple Award Contract (MAC). A MAC is a contract made with more than one supplier of the same or similar types of supplies or services at varying prices for delivery within the same geographic area. The state's obligations under a MAC are subject to the Ohio Controlling Board's continuing authorization to use the MAC program authorizing the use of Multiple Award Contracts. By the signature affixed to Page 1, of this Bid, the Bidder certifies that it is currently in compliance and will continue to adhere to the requirements of the Ohio Ethics Law, Ohio Revised Code Section 102.04. The Bidder affirms that, as applicable to the Bidder, no party listed in Ohio Revised Code Section 3517.13 (I) or (J) or spouse of such party has made, as an individual, within the two previous calendar years, one or more contributions totaling in excess of \$1,000.00 to the Governor or to his campaign committees.

CONTRACT AWARD: A Contract will be awarded to all responsive and responsible bidders.

SITE VISIT: During the bid evaluation process and prior to contract award, the state of Ohio reserves the right to have representatives from the state visit the bidder's facility. The purpose of the visit will be to review the facilities and/or equipment for the determination to meet the contract requirements.

By the signature affixed to Page 1 of this Bid, Bidder hereby certifies that the above information is true and accurate. The Bidder agrees that no changes will be made to this list of subcontractors or locations where work will be performed or data will be stored without prior written approval of DAS. Any attempt by the Bidder/Contractor to change or otherwise alter subcontractors or locations where work will be performed or locations where data will be stored, without prior written approval of DAS, will be deemed as a default. If a default should occur, DAS will seek all legal remedies as set forth in the Terms and Conditions which may include IMMEDIATE cancellation of the Contract. FAILURE TO COMPLETE THIS PAGE MAY DEEM YOUR BID NOT RESPONSIVE.

TRANSPORTATION CHARGES: Any item(s) ordered from a contract awarded pursuant to this bid shall be shipped F.O.B. destination, freight prepaid, unless noted in a Minimum Order clause below. Shipment shall be made to: Urbana Wildlife Propagation Unit, 1189 Short Game Farm Road, Urbana, Ohio 43072. Contact is: Mr. Steve Bank, Supervisor at 937-652-3213.

FIXED-PRICE WITH ECONOMIC ADJUSTMENT: The contract prices(s) will remain firm for the first six (6) months duration of the contract. Thereafter, the Contractor may submit a request to increase their price(s) to be effective thirty (30) calendar days after acceptance by DAS. No price adjustment will be permitted prior to the effective date of the increase received by the Contractor from his suppliers, or on purchase orders that are already being processed, or on purchase orders that have been filled and are awaiting shipment. If the Contractor receives orders requiring quarterly delivery, the increase will apply to all deliveries made after the effective date of the price increase.

SPECIAL CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS (Cont'd.)

The price increase must be supported by a general price increase in the cost of the finished supplies, due to increases in the cost of raw materials, labor, freight, Workers' Compensation and/or Unemployment Insurance, etc. Detailed documentation, to include a comparison list of the contract items and proposed price increases, must be submitted to support the requested increase. Supportive documentation should include, but is not limited to: copies of the old and the current price lists or similar documents which indicate the original base cost of the product to the Contractor and the corresponding increase, and/or copies of correspondence sent by the Contractor's supplier on the supplier's letterhead, which contain the above price information and explains the source of the increase in such areas as raw materials, freight, fuel or labor, etc.

Should there be a decrease in the cost of the finished product due to a general decline in the market or some other factor, the Contractor is responsible to notify DAS immediately. The price decrease adjustment will be incorporated into the contract and will be effective on all purchase orders issued after the effective date of the decrease. If the price decrease is a temporary decrease, such should be noted on the invoice. In the event that the temporary decrease is revoked, the contract pricing will be returned to the pricing in effect prior to the temporary decrease. For quarterly deliveries, any decrease will be applied to deliveries made after the effective date of the decrease. Failure to comply with this provision will be considered as a default and will be subject to Provision I.C. "Termination / Suspension" and Provision II. of the "Contract Remedies:" of the "Standard Contract Terms and Conditions".

USAGE REPORTS: Every six (6) months the contractor must submit a report (written or on disk) indicating sales generated by this contract. The report shall list usage by customer, by line item, showing the quantities/dollars generated by this contract. The report shall be forwarded to the Office of State Purchasing, 4200 Surface Road, Columbus, OH 43228-1395, Attn: Jack Hill II.

SPECIFICATIONS

I. SCOPE AND CLASSIFICATION:

A. SCOPE:

1. These specifications are for six (6) week old rooster pheasant chicks for the state of Ohio. The Department of Natural Resources, Division of Wildlife will then grow these rooster pheasant chicks and distribute them throughout the wildlife areas within the state of Ohio.

II. REQUIREMENTS:

- A. The Department of Natural Resources, Division of Wildlife anticipates purchasing approximately 18,000 six (6) week old rooster pheasant chicks during the months of April, May and June.
- B. These six (6) week old rooster pheasant chicks will be purchased in lots of 3,000 from multiple contractors.
- C. Pheasant (*Phasianus colchicus*) are to be live, six (6) week old males and must possess normal ring-necked pheasant plumage.
- D. Pheasants must be normal and in good health in all appearances. All birds must have received treatment for gape worm and marbled spleen and be treated with electrolytes (Vi-tal for example) prior to delivery.
- E. All birds must be hardened in outdoor pens for a period of not less than ten (10) days prior to delivery. Weather hardening means that the birds must either have been exposed to at least two (2) rain events or artificial mistings. A Division of Wildlife representative will inspect the birds approximately one (1) week prior to delivery to ensure weather hardening.
- F. Pheasants may be de-beaked, however, at the time of delivery each must have an upper mandible not more than 1/8" shorter than the de-beaked lower mandible.

SPECIFICATIONS (Cont'd.)

- G. Pheasants which appear to be unhealthy, severely de-beaked, poorly feathered, abnormally colored, or of otherwise poor quality will not be accepted for delivery. Such determination will be at the sole discretion of the Division of Wildlife.
- H. The contractor(s) must finalize the delivery arrangements with the Urbana Wildlife Propagation Unit at least one (1) week prior to delivery.
- I. Pheasants may not be transported over 300 miles on each delivery with time in crates not to exceed twelve (12) hours. For a period of one (1) week following delivery, the contractor(s) must be responsible for all mortality greater than 5%, if such mortality is the result of stress and/or disease caused by improper crating, handling or transportation.
 - 1. Birds imported into Ohio from other states must comply with Ohio Department of Agriculture regulation 901:1-17-12 regulating pullorum and fowl typhoid testing. Serological tests must be completed at least 3 weeks prior to delivery to the Division of Wildlife.
- J. In the event that more than 5% of the delivered birds are determined to be females, those birds must be replaced with males of comparable age. Replacement of the females to be agreed upon with the Urbana Wildlife Propagation Unit.
- K. Actual delivery schedule of acceptable rooster pheasant chicks will be agreed upon between the contractor(s) and Division of Wildlife. Delivery will normally occur between June 1 and September 15 of the calendar year. Scheduled delivery may be postponed up the three (3) days due to inclement weather at the Division's discretion at no additional cost to the Division.
